



- D. Horses DO need to be enrolled to compete in an International Hunter Derby Regional Championship and competed in one USHJA International Hunter Derby during the current season.
- E. The same horse may not compete in the USHJA International Hunter Derby Regional Championship and the National Hunter Derby at the same competition.
- F. Horses entered in this class are not required to show in any other hunter or jumper classes at the horse show.
- G. Riders are limited to competing no more than four (4) horses in the championship, however, a competition may choose to further limit the number of horses a rider can compete to three (3) horses, as long as the competition notifies the USHJA 60 days in advance of the date of the class and such limitation is printed in the prize list.
- H. Attire: Refer to HU128 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications.
- I. In accordance with USEF rules the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds.
- J. Horses may compete in multiple regional championship of the exhibitor's choice per year.

- A. All horses competing in the Derby class must be on the competition grounds a minimum of 24 hours prior to the start of the first round of the class.

- A. All horses entered must be checked into the stabling area by Saturday July 8 at 11:00am.
- B. All horses entered in the International Hunter Derby class must jog for soundness during the Official Jog prior to the start of the first round in order to compete. The Official Jog will be held Sunday July 9 in the Kovacs Schooling Ring 7:00am. This jog will be run in a manner similar to an FEI jog.
- C. A horse must be officially entered in the class before it will be allowed to jog.
- D. Proper attire is required (i.e., riding clothes or proper attire which an exhibitor would wear to compete in a model class).
- E. All horses must be presented at the Official Jog with their actual competition number and wearing a conventional hunter bridle, including noseband.
- F. The judging panel for the Official Jog shall consist of the competition veterinarian and a minimum of one judge from the judging panels officiating for the class.
- G. The jog surface must be level. Horses shall be evaluated from the side and following consultation with the veterinarian, the decision of the participating judge(s) is final and binding and not subject to further appeal of any kind.
- H. If a horse does not pass the jog; the exhibitor may request to re-present the horse to the judge(s). The judge(s) may decide to allow the horse to re-present at any time up to one hour prior to the start of the class. The vet and one of the judges from the original panel must be present.

Soundness

A. Horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the over fences performance. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the authority to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound.

Judging Format

- A. The Classic Hunter Style Round shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. These two scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.
- B. The Handy Hunter Round shall be judged on jumping style and efficiency while maintaining style and form, way of going, and overall flow. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped. These scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse- and-rider combination for this round.
- C. The Jump-Off Round, if required, shall be judged and numerically scored on quality, movement, jumping style, manners and way of going. Pace and brilliance are to be rewarded. Jumping decorations to utilize a shorter track is NOT permissible. In addition to this base score, each judging panel must award an Option Bonus Score consisting of one additional point for every higher height option fence jumped and each judging panel must award a Handy Bonus Score consisting of between zero and 10 bonus points to each horse-and- rider combination for handiness of round. These three scores must be announced separately and then added together to determine each horse-and-rider combination's score for this round from each judging panel. The scores of all the judging panels will be added together to determine the total score of each horse-and-rider combination for this round.
- D. The total scores of each horse-and-rider combination from each round will be added together to determine their final overall Hunter Derby score. This score will determine the final overall standings for the class.
- E. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point for each higher height option fence jumped must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence.

Tie Breaking Procedures

- A. Neither judging panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- B. Panel 1 breaks the ties for the Classic round/phase, Panel 2 breaks the tie for the Handy round/phase and Panel 1 breaks ties in the overall.
- C. Unless the prize list states that more than twelve (12) entries are to return for the second round, only the top twelve (12) horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
- D. All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height and handy bonus points), of the designated jump-off tie breaking judging panel.
- E. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round score.
- F. Competitors who withdraw, retire or are eliminated from a Jump-off:

a. A competitor who is eliminated in a jump-off will be tied with a competitor who retires and will be placed last of the competitors who have completed that jump-off.

b. A competitor who withdraws (does not participate) from a jump-off must always be placed after a competitor(s) eliminated or who retires while on the course.

- G. Even if only one competitor is willing to participate in the jump-off he is required to enter the arena and receive the signal to start in order to earn top placement.
- H. Withdrawing From a Jump-Off. If a competitor wishes not to take part in a jump-off he must notify the judge(s). He will be placed last of those still qualified (on the result of the previous round).

Course Requirements

- A. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round and/or jump-off are held at another time. In that case, the course for the second and/or jump-off rounds must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the second round. Copies of the course(s) must also be available for distribution at the Riders Meeting.
- B. Jumps in all Rounds.
- 1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and the course must offer a variety of Derby jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
- 2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are allowed.
- 3. A minimum 2" difference is required for the back element of an obstacle.
- 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 18" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
- 5. The jumpable portion of any obstacle must be a minimum of eight feet on its front face.
- 6. Flat cups may only be used for obstacles involving logs and/or in accordance with Federation rules.
- 7. The top rail of all obstacles must rest in a cup, except where walls with movable bricks are used.

C. Classic Hunter Style Round (First Round)

- 1. A minimum of 10 obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Style Round.
- 2. Fences must be set at 3'6 to 4'0" in height, exception option fences.
- 3. The course must include higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'0" in height (See Star System for further details.) The number of higher height option fences cannot exceed four and the jump cups on those fences must be normal deep cups of 25-30 mm. If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting obstacles and be on the less difficult track.
- 4. At least one in and out.
- 5. At least one bending line.
- 6. At least one line with an unrelated distance.
- 7. At least one fence with a long approach.

D. Handy Hunter Round (Second Round)

- 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round. 2. Fences must be set at 3'6" to 4'0" in height, exception option fences.
- 3. The course must include higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'0" in height. (See Star System for further details.). The number of higher height option fences cannot exceed four and the jump cups on those fences must be normal deep cups of 25-30 mm. If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting obstacles and be on the less difficult track.
- 4. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of three of the following handy options: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 3'0" in height. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted is not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
- 5. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

E. Jump-Off Round

- 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the jump-off round.
- 2. Fences must be set at 3'6' to 4'0" in height, exception option fences.
- 3. The course must include higher height option fences set at a minimum of 4'0" in height. (See Star System for further details.) The number of higher height option fences cannot exceed four and the jump cups on those fences must be normal deep cups of 25-30 mm. If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting obstacles and be on the less difficult track.
- 4. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must include a minimum of two of the following handy options: tight turn options, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 3'0" in height, halt and/or back. Leading over an obstacle and opening and/or closing a gate(s) while mounted or not mounted are not permitted. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.

Award Presentations

- A. All riders in the top 12 overall (or their designated representative if they are not available) must ride for ribbons in order to receive prize money.
- B. For all Member Event Series classes, USHJA will provide ribbons for the first round, second round and the overall standings.
- C. Competition management may offer additional awards (e.g., highest placing junior owner, highest placing amateur, highest placing thoroughbred, highest placing rider competing on only one entry in the class).

Membership and Participation Requirements

- Riders. owners, and trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA to participate in this class. (see GR202)
- Horses and ponies must be registered with USHJA to participate in this class. B
- Exception: Foreign residents and horses and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class but will not receive points C. unless they follow I.A. and I.B.
- D. USHJA Zone HOTY bonus points will only be awarded if the owner is a current Active member of USEF and USHJA and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA
- Ε. Money won will only count for any USHJA National Hunter Derby standings or awards if the rider, owner and trainer are current Active members of USEF and USHJA, and the horse is registered with USHJA.
- F Competition management is required to run the class if there are twelve (12) or more entries. They may choose to run the class with fewer than twelve (12) entries.
- G The number of horses a rider can compete in a National Hunter Derby may be limited if so specified in the prize list.
- H. The prize list may specify that in order to be eligible to compete in a National Hunter Derby, a horse must compete in one or two classes at the same competition.
- The same horse may not compete in the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA International Hunter Derby at the same competition. Competing in the USHJA National Hunter Derby does not qualify a horse or rider for the USHJA International Hunter Derby Championship. J.
- K. Horses entered in this class will NOT be required to jog for soundness. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the judges (GR 1033.6).
- In accordance with HU170.14 the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the National Hunter Derby L.
- Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications. M

Judging System

Each class may have the option of having either one or two panels of judges. Each panel will consist of two judges sitting together. One judge on each panel must Α. be a "R" judge, the other judge on each panel may be either a "R" or "r" judge. Each panel will provide one score for each round. See "E" for calculating the Overall Score.

No panel may award the same base score to any two (2) competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. A numerical score must be given and may be a duplicate score if it is under the cut-off.

- B. The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judges base score is given, one point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- C. The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judges' base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- Overall Score The final score from each round (3'0" with 3'5" options) will be either averaged or added as specified in the prize list to obtain the overall total for each D

horse. **Tie Breaking Procedures**

- No panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. А
- Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score (before adding height bonus points) of that round. В
- Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are C. eligible to return for the second round.
- All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie will be broken D. using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points). F
- Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- F. Prior to the start of the class, if two judging panels are used, one panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the first round and another panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the second round. The tie breaking panel for the first round will also be designated as the tie breaking panel for the jump-off round.

Schooling

During the two rounds of the National Hunter Derby, all horses entered must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Riders must wear their horse's Derby competition number while mounted. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their Derby competition number will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited.

Order of Go

- The order of go must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class.
- In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight horses (if available) separating multiple Β. rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off rides occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.
- C The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

Course Requirements

- The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round is held at another time. In Α. that case, the course for the second round must be posted a minimum of one hour prior. B.
 - Dotted lines are prohibited in both the first and second rounds of any National Hunter Derby.

Ground lines are not to exceed 18" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary. 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of 8 feet on its front face. 6. The top element of all jumps must be in cups with exceptions of walls with movable bricks. 7. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules. 8. Distances will not be ad-justed for ponies. 9. Fence height 3'0" 10. There must be four option fences set at 3'5". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting, less difficult track.

1. A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round. 2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs. 3. At least one in and out 4. At least one bending line 5. At least one line with an unrelated distance 6. At least one long approach

Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)

1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round. 2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs. 3. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'6" in height, halt and/or back. Gimmicky options are not appropriate. 4. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

Hunter sections may be run as back-to-back classes at management's discretion (HU125). When classes are run back-to-back, exhibitors may perform both rounds before leaving the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise indicated. Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule HU126. Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, panels. Individual hunter classes may be entered for 20% of the prize money offered in that class unless otherwise specified.

In all classes over obstacles, all horses being considered for an award must jog for soundness using either Option A or Option B below. Management must state in the competition prize list which method of jogging will be used. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge's decision regarding soundness is final.

- Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.
- Option B: Horses/ponies will be jogged together with the rider unmounted in the judge's order of preference. Two additional entries in addition to the number of ribbons must jog if there are sufficient entries. Horses/ponies may be asked to re-jog at the judge's discretion. A horse/pony may not leave the ring until the job has been declared official by the judge, or it will be eliminated. A horse that is unruly, one that breaks away from the handler or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, handler, other exhibitors or their entries will be eliminated. (Exception: Hunter Breeding and Pony Breeding). A horse may not be eliminated for receiving outside assistance in the jog. In classes restricted to ponies a junior must jog the pony for soundness.

All sections that may be combined will be done 24 hours prior to the division start.

2000 GRAND HUNTER CHAMPION will be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points overall from Green Hunter, Green Conformation, High Performance, High Performance Conformation and the Performance Working Hunter Divisions held during the show. In the case of a tie the award is given to the horse that accumulated the most points over fences.

HUNTER WARM-UPS

Open to all horses. These classes will not be judged. It will not be necessary to enter these warm-up classes in the competition office; but back numbers are required. Exhibitor accounts will be charged directly from the back number presented to the Ring Steward prior to entry into the arena. Competition management will not be responsible for incorrect back numbers worn in the warm-up classes.

Horses/Ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judges discretion.

USHJA GREEN HUNTER INCENTIVE NORTH REGIONAL CHAMPIONSHIP (LPHS)

Membership and Participation Requirements

A. Open to horses of any age that are eligible to compete as a Green 3'0", 3'3", 3'6" or 3'9" Hunter under Federation rules. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to verify eligibility of the horse.

B. Horses must be enrolled in the USHJA Green Hunter Incentive Program and pay the annual enrollment fee prior to competing in the Regional Championship. Additionally, horses must be registered with USHJA and recorded with USEF to participate. It is the exhibitor's responsibility to enroll their horse in a timely manner in order to be eligible to participate.

C. Horses may only be enrolled online. If a horse is enrolled during a competition, the horse's enrollment date will be considered the first day of the competition at which it was enrolled.

D. Enrolled horses are not required to have competed in a Green Hunter section at any USEF Licensed Competition to compete in a Regional Championship. However, competing in a Regional Championship will affect their Green status.

E. Horses do not need to jog.

F. Horses may be ridden by a Professional, Junior or Amateur.

G. Horses may compete in multiple Regional Championships per year.







d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section.

f. The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections.

b. Dividing:

1. In Performance Hunter, High Performance Hunter and any other sections where individual classes may be entered, the sections may only be divided after thirty (30) horses have competed in the first over fences class. Subsequent classes may be divided once twelve (12) horses have competed in each class. For Championships, see HU154

Green Conformation Hunter / High Performance Confirmation Hunter Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" and High Performance Conformation Hunter

a. Combining:

1. The Green Conformation Hunter 3'6" may only be combined with the High Performance Conformation Hunter. The High Performance Conformation Hunter may only be combined with the Green Conformation Hunter 3'6".

2. When offered as two sections, if there are fewer than four (4) horses in either the Green Conformation 3'6" or the High Performance Conformation section they must be combined.

3. When combining Green Conformation Hunter with High Performance Conformation Hunter, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined section will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees. b. Dividing: If there are four (4) or more horses in each Conformation section

they must be held separately

Green Hunter Sections

a. Combining:

1. Green Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other hunter section(s). (Exception; The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" and 3'9" sections, see HU164.1)

2. Regardless of competition rating, each Green Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries. 3. If there are fewer than three entries in a Green Hunter section, that section

must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter. 4. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section

of the Green Hunter. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two noncontiguous fence height sections may be combined.

6. If Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'0" and/or 3'3" sections are combined with Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and/or Green Hunter 3'9" sections a Handy Hunter class is not required. The combined sections must meet class number requirements for Premier or National rated Green Hunter 3'6" and Green Hunter 3'9" and use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees. BOD 8/30/21 Effective 12/1/22

7. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Green Hunter section the following applies:

a. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" section

b. If combined Green Hunter sections have fewer than three entries, they must be combined with High Performance Working Hunter.

c. A horse that is eligible for more than one section must be declared and compete

in only one. Horses will jump the respective height for the entered section. d. When combining High Performance Working Hunter with another section, if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry fees.

e. When combining a section of High Performance Hunter with either a section of Green Hunter 3'6", Green Hunter 3'9", or both, the combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Green Hunter section(s) with which it is combined. In addition, a section entry fee will be required and individual classes may no longer be entered for the combined section.

f. The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with a combined Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" section but may not be combined with any Green Hunter 3'3" or 3'0 sections

b. Dividing:

1. Regardless of competition rating, any Green Hunter section that is offered combined must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or as one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous sections.

Young Hunter Sections

a. Combining: 1. Young Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other Hunter section. 2. At Competition Management's discretion, and with at least three (3) Young Hunters entered in any section, the Young Hunter Section(s) may run concurrently with the corresponding Green Hunter height section or Combined Green Hunter Section. Horses that are entered in both the Young Hunter and Green Hunter section(s) will be eligible for awards in both sections. Horses that are not entered in both sections will only be eligible for awards in the section in which they are entered. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in any of the Young Hunter section(s) they must be combined for awards per HU166.3. A separate entry fee for the Young Hunter Section will apply. The Green Hunter section requirements by rating listed in HU166.2 will still apply.

3. Regardless of competition rating, each Young Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries. If there are fewer than three (3) entries in a Young Hunter section that section must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Young Hunter. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two non-contiguous fence height sections may be combined b. Dividing:

1. Regardless of competition rating, any Young Hunter section that is offered as a combined section must be split by fence height, and sections held separately when there is a minimum of three entries in any one fence height section provided at least three (3) entries remain in each of the other two sections, which would also be held separately, or one other combined section. Contiguous fence height sections should be combined before combining non-contiguous fence height sections

Junior Hunter

a. Combining:

1. The Junior Hunter 3'6", Junior Hunter 3'3", Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6", and Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3" sections may only be combined with other Junior Hunter or Amateur Owner Hunter sections. See below for conditions.

2. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, Competition Management may choose to combine the sections. The Competition Management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions.

3. It is recommended that when competitions anticipate 50 horses or more this section be divided by age of rider or height of horse when prize list is prepared. b. Dividing:

1. When divided, sections must be split using one of the methods from HU161 Methods of Dividing.

2. If there are 50 or more entries in the section at the beginning of the first class it must be divided and the prize money must be doubled. A section with less than 30 entries cannot be divided.

3. If there are 50 or more entries remaining in a section after it has been divided, the section must be redivided and the prize money must be doubled. Once a section has been redivided it may be divided further if management so desires. 4. If the Junior Hunter sections are divided by height of animal, they must be divided into Large and Small. Premier rated Junior Hunter 3'6" sections at Premier rated competitions must be offered as four sections (large/younger, large/older, small/ younger, small/older).

5. If there are four (4) or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than four (4) entries in any sections divided by age and/or height of animal, those sections must be combined with other sections. If there is a minimum of twelve (12) entries once any sections have been combined, the newly combined section must be redivided. Management may determine a cut off time for entering before redividing any section(s).

Amateur Owner 3'6" or Amateur Owner 3'3"

a. Combining:

1. The Amateur Owner Hunter 3'6". Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3". Junior Hunter 3'6", and Junior Hunter 3'3" sections may only be combined with other Amateur Owner Hunter or Junior Hunter sections. See below for conditions.

2. At Premier. National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than four (4) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, competition management may choose to combine the sections. The competition management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections

are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list fpr Premier rated competitions.

3. At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, these sections may be combined. The competition management may choose to combine the classes as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. b. Dividing:

1. Amateur Owner 3'6" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are six or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than six entries in either divided section, they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be redivided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU162 & HU160 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) Management may determine a cutoff time for entering before redividing any section(s). When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on the entry blank. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

2. Amateur Owner 3'3" When a section is divided, one section must be offered for amateurs 18-35 and one section for amateurs over 35 years of age. If there are six or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately. If there are fewer than six entries in either divided section, they must be combined. If there are a minimum of 12 entries once the sections are combined, the newly combined section must be re-divided using either a Floating or California Split. (See HU162 & HU160 for definition of a Floating and California Split.) When using a floating split the age groups must be posted at the competition office. Rider age must be given on entry blank. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number.

Pony Hunter

a. Combining:

1. The Regular Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections. 2. Height sections may be combined if there are three (3) or fewer entries in any height section. Combined height sections should be either small/medium of medium/large but if possible not small/large.

b. Dividina:

1. Classes for Pony Hunters may be divided by height of pony as outlined in HU141. 2. If there are 50 or more entries in the division at the beginning of the first class, it must be divided by height of pony and prize money must be doubled.

3. If there are 50 entries remaining in a section after the section has been divided by height of pony, the section must be re-divided by every other number and the prize money must be doubled.

4. Once a section has been re-divided it may not be divided further

5. If a pony under saddle class has over 30 entries, the class must be split and held in at least two sections with one set of awards.

6. If there are four (4) or more entries in each height section of a Premier or National rated Regular Pony Hunter section, the height sections must be held separately.

7. If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height Section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); prize money need not be doubled. If there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled

Green Hunter Pony

a. Combining:

1. The Green Pony Hunter Section may not be combined with any other sections. 2. Green Pony Hunter Sections at National and Premier rated competitions may be combined if there are less than four (4) entries in any height section.

h. Dividing: 1. National and Premier rated competitions must split (small, medium and large) if there are four (4) or more entries in any height section.

2. If there are a minimum of 10 small/medium ponies combined and 10 large ponies in any Regional rated Regular or Green height section, the height section must be divided (small/medium and large); prize money need not be doubled. If there is a total of thirty (30) ponies, prize money must be doubled.

Adult Amateur Hunter

a. Competitions must offer Adult Amateur Hunter sections in accordance with the specifications of each USHJA Zone

b. Notice of the use of a floating split and the age groups must be posted at the competition office. When divided as to age of rider no horse may compete in more than one section. Age must be given on entry blank. These sections may be further divided by age of rider or by every other number. If there are fewer than six entries in any divided section, the sections must be combined. If there are six or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately.

c. If there are fewer than six (6) entries in any divided section, the sections must be combined. If there are six (6) or more entries in each divided section the divided sections must be held separately.

Children's Hunter


a. Children's Hunter sections must be split in accordance with applicable Zone Specifications

b. If there are fewer than six entries in any divided section, the sections must be combined. If there are six or more entries in each divided section, the divided sections must be held separately.



From New York City and New Jersey

Take the NY State Thruway (I-87) north to the Adirondack Northway (Exit 24 in Albany). Follow 87 to Exit 30. Pick up Rt. 9 north and follow it for two miles to Rt. 73. Continue on 73 for 28 miles to Lake Placid area.

From Montreal

From Ottawa

Notice to All Exhibitors Regarding Helmets, Electronic Devices & Safe Sport Rules

To All Riders: Please note that the Lake Placid Horse Shows would like to reiterate that the mandatory helmet rule that took effect on April 1, 2012, will continue to be enforced this year on the Lake Placid Horse Show Grounds. The rule has been implemented nationwide at all USEF licensed hunter/jumper competitions.

The rule requires that anyone on horseback on the property wear a helmet at all times. This consists of anyone showing, schooling, or riding horses on and off of the show grounds, including grooms. This is a facility-wide rule.

The Lake Placid Horse Shows will be enforcing the rule with the support of the United States Equestrian Federation. This is a zero tolerance policy and must be taken extremely serious as it is for the safety of everyone involved. Anyone on a horse without a helmet will be asked to dismount immediately.

Any insubordination will be penalized and the individuals will be fined and expelled from the property. Helmets must be worn at all times, so please plan accordingly. The Lake Placid Horse Show Association would like to thank everyone for in advance for acting in accordance with the USEF rule GR801 which is stated below.

The USEF rule GR801.2 reads: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Manage- ment, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES: The unsafe use of electronic devices, as determined by the competition steward in their sole discretion, including cell phones while mounted is prohibited in all areas designated for schooling and exercise, and while lungeing horses on competition grounds. Earphone(s)/Earbud(s) are prohibited in all areas designated for schooling and exercise.

SAFE SPORT Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeSport training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. General Rules & Regulations

1. Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE, COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRES-SAGE COMPETITIONS, ENDURANCE RIDES AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS: (SEE GR828.4 OF THE FEDERATION RULES). LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETI-TIONS AT THE ADVANCED LEVEL, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE, OR AGENT, AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETI-TIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT (EXCEPTION: FRIESIAN PERFORMANCE FR231) AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF IN-TRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; 7) NRHA ENDORSED REINING COMPETITIONS. 8) OPPORTUNITY CLASSES, 9) CITIZENS OF OTHER NATIONS WHO HAVE PROOF, IN ENGLISH, OF CURRENT MEMBERSHIP IN GOOD STANDING OF THEIR OWN NATIONAL FEDERATION, 10) USEA BEGINNER NOVICE DIVISION; AND 11) ASSISTANT HAN-DLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of The United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the Lake Placid Horse Shows. I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules. I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered. I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cable - casts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation. The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State. See GR908.4.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchipping NEW 12/1/17: HU101 - JP 100 - EQ103 - A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the nuchal ligament of the animal. This rule will have a transition period from December 1, 2017 to November 30, 2018. During this period, animals that are not in compliance with this rule will not receive points or be eligible for Federation and/or USHJA programs and awards. After this period, all horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions.

2. OPENING & CLOSING DATES:

- a) Entries will be limited on a First-Come First-Serve basis (USEF GR 907.1 & 915.2a). Entries open immediately upon publication of this prize list. The closing date for entries will be Friday, May 26, 2023.
- b) The Lake Placid Horse Show Association requires that nomination fees, hunter, equitation fees, grounds fees, stabling fee, \$20 Ambulance Fee, \$75 Office fee and USEF Drug & non refundable Office Processing Fee accompany each entry blank.

Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to the Lake Placid Horse Show Association in United States funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed.

3. ENTRIES & NOMINATIONS

- a) Entries for all hunter and equitation classes close Friday, May 26. Entries will be accepted the day of the class at management's discretion. A post entry charge of \$40 per class or \$80 per hunter section will apply.
- b) Nominations for all Jumper Sections and classes close May 26. Post nominations will be accepted after May 26 at the regular nominating fee plus a late charge of \$125 unless otherwise stated.
- c) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (see Rule No. 15) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 pm the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes other than Grand Prix and Classic declarations.
- d) Late or improper Grand Prix/Challenge Cup/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 \$35,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 will be assessed without exception. In the event of acceptance of a later declaration where Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- Horses competing in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- Each entry form must give the owner, rider, trainer, and horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider and trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers.
- g) USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per competition (\$15 Drug & Medication, \$8 USEF) and a \$7 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their USEF/ USHJA membership card to the Competition Secretary. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card must be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced. For membership info go to www.USEF.org or www.USHJA.org.
- h) USEF / USHJA Show Pass Fee:

USEF Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.

Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.

To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.

The online Show Pass form will be available on the USEF website and can be accessed at the following URL: https://www.usef.org/show-pass The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.

USHJA Show Pass fee for non members of the USHJA \$30 per competition.

- USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix are subject to USEF International High Performance fee in accordance with GR 207. A \$35 per horse fee will be accessed for each horse on a per class basis.
- j) The responsible party as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- k) If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions; management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on USEF National Horse of The Year points earned from December 1, 2021 to November 30, 2022. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries.
- A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.
- m) Non-Competing Horse Fee: A fee of \$100 will be charged to each horse who is on grounds and not competing in a horse show.

4. SCRATCHES:

 Horses entered in hunter sections, classes or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition

Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$75 per hunter section and the non refundable Office Processing Fee. Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary prior to the start of the class or classes being scratched. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition.

- b) In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- c) \$100 of the nomination fee will be refunded to the owners of horses that have been scratched (scratch sheet) twenty-four hours prior to the start of the competition. If the horse is scratched within 24 hours to the start of the competition, an Official Veterinarian's Certificate filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian must be presented to the Secretary prior to the conclusion of the last class of the competition in order to obtain this refund. If a horse is scratched after competing in any class at the competition, no refund of the nominating fee will be given.
- HUNTER SCORING: The open numerical hunter scoring system will be used at the discretion of Management.
- 6. COURTESY CIRCLE: Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes in accordance with USEF rules.
- 7. HORS CONCOURS: No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concurs' during the competition.
- COMPETITION RING ACCESS: Horses will not be allowed in the competition rings for schooling before competition hours with the exception of warm-up days. Hand walking of horses may be permitted at management's discretion.
- 9. NUMBERS: Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.
- 10. ATTIRE:
 - a) Appropriate dress is required in all classes.
 - b) Formal Jumper Attire. Dark, muted or similar colored, or red (scarlet) coats are required; team or sponsored coats of different colors are also permitted; white or fawn breeches; a white tie, choker (unless the shirt, by design, has the chocker built in for its intended use) or hunting stock, and a white or lightly colored shirt must be worn. Shirts must have a white collar and white cuffs. Shirts must be fastened at the neck and tucked into breeches. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn. Members of the Armed Services or the police may wear the service dress uniform with protective head-gear. (See General Rules, GR801.2)

Proper Jumper Attire. Coats of any color are required. Breeches must be light color (white, fawn or canary). Pas- tel and dark colored breeches are not allowed. Shirts, light in color, must be tucked into breeches and fastened at the top of the neck. Ties or chokers of any color must be worn (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use). Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

Standard Jumper Attire. Coats are not required. Breeches of any color are permitted. Shirts (polo shirts are permitted) must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short), and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

In extreme weather conditions, the use of jackets, sweaters or raincoats can be allowed by management and/or permission from the Jumper Judge/s. Permission must be granted before entering the competition ring.

In cases where the above requirements are not followed, the penalty for a first or minor offense will be a warning and for repeated violations by the same exhibitor at the same event, the penalty may be elimination.

c. Hunter Riders are required to wear conservatively colored coats (black, blue, green, grey or brown) which are free from adornment which in the judge's opinion is overly distracting. Shirts must have a choker, similar collar or tie. Breeches may be buff, canary, tan, rust or white.

Hunter Formal Attire. Riders are required to wear scarlet or dark coats; white shirts with white stock; white, buff or canary breeches. Members of the Armed Services or the Police may wear the Service Dress Uniform.

Hunter Inappropriate attire. When management permits Hunter or Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation riders to ride without jackets, riders must wear traditional, short, or long-sleeved riding shirts with chokers or ties. Polo shirts and full chaps are not permitted except in unjudged warm-up classes. Management or Judge may eliminate an exhibitor who is inappropriately attired. See GR 801 & HU129.

- ALL exhibitors must wear properly fitted protective headgear with a chin strap that passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards while riding on the competition grounds. (USEF GR 801.2)
- e) No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, etc.) while in the competition ring. The penalty for wearing or carrying a forbidden device if observed by the judge is elimination from the class during which the device was worn or carried. Exception: A handicapped participant may use electronic devices if, prior to the class, he/she presents to the USEF Steward written justification from treating personnel setting forth the necessity of the equipment.
- f) USEF Rule HU-3 & JP103: The use of any device with ear bud(s) while mounted is prohibited in all hunter and jumper schooling rings.
- 11. AWARD CEREMONIES: Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Team competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present will result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class.
- 12. ORDERS OF GO: Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU 126. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that the necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over three (3) minutes due to conflicts.
- 13. STABLING:
 - a) The Lake Placid Horse Show Association has the right to permit horses to come and go at will. We have elected to do so within certain guidelines upholding our no poling policy.
 - b) Stabling will be temporary 10'x10' housed under canvas with stall doors on prepared dirt flooring. Fee of \$350 per stall tax included for each show and will be on a first come first serve basis. A charge of \$25 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date of entries.
 - c) Competing out of a van or truck parked on the competition grounds is prohibited.
 - d) Horses will be admitted to the show grounds, between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. according to the following schedule: Lake Placid Horse Show, Sunday, June 25 and I Love New York Horse Show, Monday, July 3. No horses will be allowed to enter the show grounds prior to Sunday, June 25. Anyone wishing to arrive at any other time must make special arrangements with the management call (518) 523-9625.
 - e) Initial bedding will not be provided.
 - f) Unless special arrangements are made with management, stalls must be vacated no later than 12:00 noon the day following the conclusion of each competition.
 - g) STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.
 - Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done to their stalls, intentionally or not, and will be charged accordingly.
 - Tack and feed stalls may be withheld without warning if the maximum number of stalls per show has been reached. This may occur prior to the closing date.
- 14. COURSES: In accordance with USEF rules.
- 15. COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS: Competition days Open one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 5:00 pm whichever is later. Non-Competition Day hours will be from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.
- 16. ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT: All accounts must be settled in full no later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day of each scheduled competition. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the grounds, a release must be obtained from the Competition Secretary.
- 17. CHECK CASHING: Lake Placid Exhibitors only will be allowed to have checks approved and endorsed. All checks must be endorsed by an authorized Lake Placid Horse Show personnel. Upon endorsement by an authorized officer, exhibitors must present their check to Community Bank. Checks presented for cash at Community Bank must be properly endorsed by an Authorized Competition Official. Photo id is required at Community Bank. A fine of \$100 will be charged and suspension of check cashing privileges for any member presenting a non-negotiable check. Persons presenting non-negotiable checks may be subject to prosecution.

18. PRIZE MONEY:

- a) All entries must be accompanied by a W-9 form in order to receive prize money. Prize money will be credited to entry show account. IRS 1099 Miscellaneous Income Forms will be issued to the payee as listed on the entry form.
- b) Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social

General Rules & Regulations

Security number and will be asked to complete Form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.

- **19. FARRIER:** No farrier other than the official competition farrier will be permitted to shoe on the grounds without the express permission of the management. Exhibitors wishing to use another farrier must request a permit for that farrier at the stabling office.
- 20. FEED & BEDDING: Provided by the 'Official Feed Store' of the Lake Placid Horse Shows. In order to assure exhibitors of an adequate supply of feed based on fair market prices, no other feed vendor other than the Official Feed Store will be permitted on the grounds without the express permission of the Management.
- 21. ASSIGNED PARKING: Limited reserved parking spaces will be assigned with no fee. Check in the Horse Show Office.
- 22. DOGS: All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the Lake Placid Horse Show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the show grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 23. MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors, and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

(HJ104.3) Any trainer, owner, exhibitor or their agent found improperly disposing of needles or other sharp instruments will be fined \$100.

24. LIABILITY

- a) The Lake Placid Horse Show Association, The Town of North Elba, North Elba Parks and Recreation District, US Security Associates, and Morrissey Management Group and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at all of the shows listed in this publication.
- b) The Lake Placid Horse Show Association, The Town of North Elba, North Elba Parks and Recreation District, US Security Associates, and Morrissey Management Group and their officials and employees will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged packages received / delivered to the show grounds.
- c) "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agent or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date."
- 25. HORSE SHOW VAN PARKING will not be permitted on the show grounds. Upon arrival

LOCAL LAWS

VERY IMPORTANT RULES TO REMEMBER

WHILE VISITING LAKE PLACID!

Welcome to Lake Placid and the Lake Placid Horse Shows. We are so glad you came! While you are in Lake Placid, we want you to have a great time and enjoy your stay. Here are just a few reminders to take notice of while you are in our town:

1. CELL PHONE WARNING: Use of a hand-held cellular telephone to engage in a call while driving is prohibited in New York State pursuant to Vehicle and Traffic Law Section 1225c. Please be aware of this law and use your hands free cell phone accessories while driving.

2. REDUCED SPEED LIMITS: Please be aware of reduced speed limits and adhere to all posted speed limit signs.

3. LOCAL PARKING LAWS: No parking where there are no parking spaces. Pay special attention to Handicap parking areas as well as unloading zones. Please remember that parking on Main Street is metered. Please make sure you feed the meters. The fee is one (1) quarter (\$.25) for every 15 minutes you utilize the parking space.

4. WEAR YOUR SEATBELT: Please be aware that the seatbelt law is strictly enforced in Lake Placid! Click it or get a ticket.

all drivers will be given directions to a parking lot (with 24 hour security) 2 miles from the show grounds. We find this necessary to alleviate parking congestion on the show grounds.

26. MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds.

Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

27. LPHSA GENERAL & ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to the Lake Placid Horse Show Association, Inc. and Stadium Jumping, Inc. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment.

Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose.

At all times for horses competing on the Lake Placid Horse Show grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR839 (which defines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR844 (which pertains to Poling), and GR803 (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties.

To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing on the Lake Placid Horse Show Grounds, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed.

28. POLING AND OFF-SETS:

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at the Lake Placid Horse Show Grounds. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

29. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS:

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to four lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a twenty-four (24) hour period starting from the time of the incident.

In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES/PONIES

- A. New York regulations require that all equines be covered by official interstate health certificates, issued by a licensed veterinarian, showing that the animals are free from any symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease. The certificate shall include the name of the owner and address and destination, number of horses examined, the name, registration number(s), if any, tattoo, if any, sex, age, rectal temperature, color, and markings of each animal listed. Health certificates will become void after 30 days from issue. Health certificates must show animals to be negative to an equine infectious anemia test within the past 12 months. Date of test and approved laboratory must be shown on health certificate. Equine Rhinopneuonitis vaccination is not required; however, if any animal is vaccinated, it is ineligible for entry within 21 days of vaccination. Vehicles transporting animals must have certificates showing that it was cleaned and disinfected under veterinary supervision prior to loading. This information can be written on the health certificate.

Importing a Horse into the United States call to find out current rates and whether or not you are required to do a 3-Day, 7-Day or 60 day Quarantine. Go to http://www.aphis/usda.gov/vs/ncie.

It is prudent to check with the State of destination as to any additional State Health requirements that must be met. Some States have health requirements that are in addition to those required by the Federal Government.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

- 1. At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- 3. In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- 4. In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
- Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.
