ELIGIBILITY: To be eligible for the Jumper Division horses must be nominated. Once a horse is nominated, he becomes eligible to compete in the following

sections: Jumper 1.40m, 1.35m, 1.30m, 1.25m, 1.20m, Amateur Jumper, Junior Jumper, and all special classes held in the Jumper Division, if

otherwise eligible.

RECORDING: The Federation maintains records of winnings in classes at licensed competitions. Jumpers must be recorded with the Federation in order to

receive points towards any USEF or USHJA Zone or Horse of the Year awards. Any change of a recorded horses's name and/or ownership must

Entry Fee: \$375 (includes \$35 fee to USHJA)

Membership and Participation Requirements

- Riders, owners, and trainers must be current Active members of USEF and USHJA to participate in this class. (see GR202).
- B. Horses and ponies must be registered with USHJA to participate in this class.
- Exception: Foreign residents and horses and ponies in good standing with their National Federation are eligible to compete in this class but will not receive C. points unless they follow I.A. and I.B.
- D. USHJA National and Zone HOTY bonus points will only be awarded if the owner is a current Active member of USEF and USHJA and the horse is recorded with USEF and registered with USHJA.
- E. Money won will only count for any USHJA National Hunter Derby standings or awards if the rider, owner and trainer are current Active members of USEF and USHJA, and the horse is registered with USHJA.
- F. Competition management is required to run the class if there are twelve (12) or more entries. They may choose to run the class with twelve (12) or less
- G. The number of horses a rider can compete in a National Hunter Derby may be limited if so specified in the prize list.
- The prize list may specify that in order to be eligible to compete in a National Hunter Derby, a horse must compete in one (1) or two (2) classes at the same competition.
- The same horse may not compete in the USHJA National Hunter Derby and the USHJA International Hunter Derby at the same competition. Ι.
- Competing in the USHJA National Hunter Derby does not qualify a horse or rider for the USHJA International Hunter Derby Championship. J.
- Soundness -Horses entered in this class will NOT be required to jog for soundness. All horses are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of the K. over fences phase listed below. Horses may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion. Judges have the authority to disqualify a horse if deemed unsound. Any unsoundness during the competition will be reflected in the scores from the judges (GR1033.6).
- Traditional Format Horses must trot for soundness at the conclusion of the Classic Round. If the class is held over two days, horses are required to trot a. a circle on a loose rein at the end of both Classic and Handy Rounds.
- Hunt and Go Format horses must trot for soundness at the conclusion of the Handy Round phase. h
- In accordance with HU 174.14 the same horse-and-rider combination must compete in both rounds of the National Hunter Derby. Attire: Refer to HU107 in the USEF Rule Book for current specifications. Due to inclement weather, competition management may excuse hunt coats or allow waterproof outerwear so long as the exhibitor's back number is worn correctly and visible.

Judging System

- Each class may have the option of having either one (1) or two (2) panels of judges. Each panel will consist of two (2) judges sitting together. One (1) judge on each panel must be a USEF "R" judge, the other judge on each panel may be either a USEF "R" or USEF "r" judge. Each panel will provide one (1) score for each round. See "E" for calculating the Overall Score. Management may choose to run a standard formatted Derby with fifteen (15) or fewer entries with one USEF (R) judge.
- В. No panel may award the same base score to any two (2) competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score. A numerical score must be given and may be a duplicate score if it is under the cut-off.
- The first round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, and movement. After the judge(s) base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- The second round shall be judged on performance, hunter pace, jumping style, quality and substance, movement, handiness and brilliance of pace. Handiness is defined as ground saving movement without adversely affecting performance or style. Brilliance of pace is defined as a faster pace than ordinary, without sacrificing performance or style. Handiness is taken into account in the judges' base score. After the judge(s)' base score is given, one (1) point will be added for each high option fence jumped. The Option Bonus Score of one additional point must be awarded even if there is a refusal, rail down or loss of good jumping style at that higher height option fence, providing that the horse-and-rider combination does jump the higher height option fence. (Maximum of four points.)
- Overall Score The final score from each round (3'0" with 3'5" options) will be added to obtain the overall total for each horse. E.
- F. Hunt and Go - *Please note this Hunt and Go is judged differently than the International Hunter Derby Hunt and Go.

Tie Breaking Procedures

- Α No judge or panel may award the same base score to any two competitors in any one round unless a competitor's score is below the cut-off score.
- В Any ties in all rounds will be broken by the base score (before adding height bonus points) of that round.
- Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.
- All ties for overall first place in the class will compete in a jump-off round. In the case of unsafe conditions preventing a jump-off from being held, the tie D will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- E. Ties for other than first place in the overall standings will be broken using the second round base score (before adding height bonus points).
- Prior to the start of the class, if two judging panels are used, one panel must be designated as the tie breaking panel for the first round and another panel must F. be designated as the tie breaking panel for the second round. The tie breaking panel for the first round will also be designated as the tie breaking panel for the jump-off round.

Schooling

During the two rounds of the National Hunter Derby, all horses entered must be ridden in official horse show schooling areas unless Management designates a specific schooling area for National Hunter Derby horses. Riders must wear their horse's Derby competition number while mounted. This includes horses entered simultaneously in another class, if any. Entered horses ridden or schooled elsewhere on the competition grounds or NOT wearing their Derby competition number will be eliminated from competing in the Derby and the entry fee will be forfeited.

Order of Go

- The order of go must be posted a minimum of one hour prior to the start of the class. A.
- In the case of multiple horses being ridden by the same rider, every effort will be made so that there will be a minimum of eight horses (if available) separating multiple rides. All horses must be ridden in the sequence that appears on the jumping order in the first round of the competition. In the second round horses will return in reverse order of their first round scores (lowest to highest). Due to multiple or rider conflicts, any rider may elect to move up in the order. Should a jump-off rides occur, horses will return in the same order in which they competed in the second round.
- C. The draw may be performed by hand or competition management may host a computer draw.

USHJA National Hunter Derby

Course Requirements

A. The course diagrams for each round must be posted a minimum of one (1) hour before the start of the first round, unless the second round is held at another time. In that case, the course for the second round must be posted a minimum of one hour prior. Hand walking is permitted prior to the National Hunter Derby class.

B. Dotted lines are prohibited in both the first and second rounds of any National Hunter Derby.

C. Jumps in ALL Rounds

- 1. Obstacles must simulate those reminiscent of the hunt field and course must offer a variety of Classic jumps with different appearances such as: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence or gate, coop, aiken, hedge, oxer, brush, logs, natural foliage.
 - 2. Natural obstacles such as banks and ditches are allowed.
 - 3. A minimum of 2" difference is required for the back element of all oxers.
 - 4. Ground lines are not to exceed 18" in depth from the vertical plane of the jump. For appropriate jumps, no ground line is necessary.
 - 5. The jumpable portion of any fence must be a minimum of 8 feet on its front face
 - 6. The top element of all jumps must be in cups except for walls with movable bricks.
 - 7. Flat cups may only be used for log fences and in accordance with Federation rules.
 - 8. Distances will not be adjusted for ponies.
 - 9. Fence height 3'0"
 - 10. There must be four option fences set at 3'5". If there is a difference in difficulty between any two tracks containing height options, the higher options should include the more inviting, less difficult track.

Classic Hunter Style Course (First Round)

- 1. A minimum of ten obstacles must be offered in the Classic Hunter Round.
- 2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs.
- 3. At least one in and out
- 4. At least one bending line
- 5. At least one line with an unrelated distance
- 6. At least one long approach

Handy Hunter Course (Second Round)

- 1. A minimum of eight obstacles must be offered in the Handy Hunter Round.
- 2. At least three of the following types of fences must be utilized: natural post and rail, stone wall, white board fence, riviera gate, coop, aiken, hedge, brush or logs.
- 3. The course should simulate riding over hunt country and must have a minimum of two handy options, such as: tight turns, different tracks, clever options for jump approaches, pen type obstacles, hand gallop a jump, trot a lowered obstacle not to exceed 2'6" in height, halt and/or back. Gimmicky options are not appropriate.
- 4. Unless the prize list states that more than 12 entries are to return for the second round, then only the top 12 horses from the first round, after all ties are broken, are eligible to return for the second round.

Competition Requirements

- A. A National Hunter Derby may be offered at USEF Licensed Channel I (Premier or National), or Channel II (Regional) rated competitions, or competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status.
- B. Competition Management will collect and remit to USHJA the \$35 per horse entrant fee at Channel I (Premier and National) rated competitions and competitions that have been approved for a Special Competition status, and the \$25 per horse entrant fee at Channel II (Regional) competitions.
- C. Management may choose to offer a second USHJA National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs.
 - 1. Cross entry of horse between the two National Hunter Derbies is not permitted.
 - 2. The two (2) National Hunter Derbies may run concurrently or separate at the discretion of competition management.
 - 3. Prize money for each class must meet the minimum requirements outlined in Section X, as designated by the competition's rating.
 - 4. If there are twelve (12) or less entries in either class (National Hunter Derby and National Hunter Derby restricted to Juniors and Amateurs), the two classes must be combined. When combined, the prize money must be equal or greater than the highest amount offered to any one (1) class prior to combining
 - 5. Once the National Hunter Derby is split Junior and Amateur riders may choice to compete in the Open Section.
- D. When there are (40) or more entries, the class may be split into two (2) separate classes. If there are fifty (50) or more entries, the class must be split into two (2) or three (3) separate classes. Management may determine a cutoff time for entering before splitting the National Hunter Derby. The cutoff time will be no earlier than 24 hours prior to the proposed start time of the National Hunter Derby. When the class is split, the original advertised prize money offered must be doubled, or tripled, and split in accordance to how many sections are offered.
 - 1. A two-way split will be offered as one Open section and one Restricted section for Juniors and Amateurs.
 - a. If there are fewer than twelve (12) entries in either the Open or Restricted section, then the original entry list will be split by a random draw into two equal sections.
 - b. Prize Money for a two-way split will be divided equally at 50% to each section.
 - 2. A three-way split will be offered as one Open section, one Junior section, and one Amateur section.
 - a. If there are fewer than twelve in any section, then a two-way split must be utilized.
 - b. Prize Money for a three-way split will be divided to each section as follows: 33% to the Open section, 33.5% to the Junior section, and 33.5% to the Amateur section.
 - 3. If there are fifty (50) or more entries in any section after the original split, then the section will be divided in half by a random draw and placed separately. Prize money must be divided equally at 50% to each new section. Management must adjust the entry fee according to the reduced prize money offered if the sections are split. If the sections are split but the entry fee is not reduced, then prize money must be doubled.
 - 4. Cross-entry of horses between the two (2) or three (3) National Hunter Derbies is not permitted.

Awards: Trophy to first, one set of Ribbons thru 12th place; prize money divided as follows: 30%, 22%, 13%, 8%, 6%, 5%, 4%, 3%, 3%, 2%, 2%, 2%.0 & Ribbons for Highest Scoring Amateur and Junior Riders

Hunter sections may be run as back-to-back classes at management's discretion (HU125). When classes are run back-to-back, exhibitors may perform both rounds before leaving the ring. All classes will be judged on performance and soundness unless otherwise indicated. Starting orders will be produced and run in accordance with USEF Rule HU126. Courses will simulate fences found in the hunting field such as: brush, wall, in and out, oxer, post and rails, gate, aiken, panels. Individual hunter classes may be entered for 20% of the prize money offered in that class unless otherwise specified.

In all rated hunter sections a numerical score will be given by the judges.

In all classes over obstacles, all horses being considered for an award must jog for soundness using either Option A or Option B below. Management must state in the competition prize list which method of jogging will be used. Horses/ponies that are unsound will be eliminated and ineligible for an award in that class. The judge's decision regarding soundness is final.

Option A: Horses/ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Horses/ponies may be asked to return to the

ring and trot another circle at the judge's discretion.

Horses/ponies will be jogged together with the rider unmounted in the judge's order of preference. Two additional entries in addition to the number of ribbons must jog if there are sufficient entries. Horses/ponies may be asked to re-jog at the judge's discretion. A horse/pony may not leave the ring until the job has been declared official by the judge, or it will be eliminated. A horse that is unruly, one that breaks away from the handler or one whose actions threaten to endanger the rider, handler, other exhibitors or their entries will be eliminated. (Exception: Hunter Breeding and Pony Breeding). A horse may not be eliminated for receiving outside assistance in the jog. In classes restricted to ponies a junior must jog the pony for soundness.

All sections that may be combined will be done 24 hours prior to the division start.

2000 GRAND HUNTER CHAMPION will be awarded to the horse that has accumulated the most points overall from Green Hunter, Green Conformation, High Performance, High Performance Conformation and the Performance Working Hunter Divisions held during the show. In the case of a tie the award is given to the horse that accumulated the most points over fences.

HUNTER WARM-UPS

Option B:

Open to all horses. These classes will not be judged. It will not be necessary to enter these warm-up classes in the competition office; but back numbers are required. Exhibitor accounts will be charged directly from the back number presented to the Ring Steward prior to entry into the arena. Competition management will not be responsible for incorrect back numbers worn in the warm-up classes.

Pony Hunter Section

(HU140 - 142) No junior over 12 years of age may ride in a Regular Small Pony Hunter Section. No junior over 14 years of age may ride in a Regular Medium Pony Hunter Section. (Exception: Green Pony Hunters) Riders under 18 years of age may rider for other exhibitors who have more than one entry in the Under Saddle class and/or exhibit the pony in the model class. Ponies must be handled by junior exhibitors in all phases of a class, except in breeding classes in-hand. Ponies shown in any rated Hunter Pony, Green Pony Hunter, Children's Pony Hunter, or Pony Jumper sections may not be shown by a suitable exhibitor 18 years of age or older at the same competition, except in breeding classes in-hand. Stallions are prohibited from all classes except breeding. No animal may be shown in a performance class in this division unless the owner possesses a current measurement card or valid measurement form issued by the Federations .

No rider may show more than three ponies in any one height section. Junior riders showing ponies cannot compete in any class where fences may be set higher than 3'6" at the same competition (Exception children's Jumpers, Green Pony Hunters and Pony Jumpers).

Ponies shown by adults at a Recognized competition cannot compete in any rated Pony Hunter sections at the same competition with a junior rider.

In classes over fences small ponies not ponies are not to exceed 12.2 hands to jump 2'3"; medium ponies over 12.2 and not exceeding 13.2 hands to jump 2'6"; large ponies over 13.2 and not exceeding 14.2 hands to jump 3'. All classes to be judged on performance and soundness, except where otherwise noted. Manners and suitability of a pony for a rider shall be emphasized and extreme speed will be penalized. Full championship points in all classes.

Ponies are required to trot a circle on a loose rein at the end of each over fences performance. Ponies may be asked to return to the ring and trot another circle at the judges discretion.

Competitors may only ride two ponies per height section.

Round One will consist of classes Small Pony 2903, Medium Pony 2918 and Large Pony 2933.

The Second Round will consist of the top 12 scores from Round One.

An open numerical judging system must be used. One judging position must be appointed as the tie breaker.

If a horse/rider combination does not return for the second round or is eliminated during the second round of a classic, a score of zero will be combined with the first round score and the horse/rider combination will be placed accordingly.

Attire: riders are required to wear scarlet or dark coats; white shirts with white stock, choker or tie; white, buff or canary breeches and protective headgear in accordance with GR 801.2.



To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF EQ113 Tests 1-17. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. 3016 DOVER SADDLERY USEF HUNTER SEAT MEDAL

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

USEF Hunter Seat Medal Classes are open to Individual Junior Members in good standing who have not reached their 18th birthday in accordance with GR127. Affiliated Members are not eligible. No credit will be given for winnings before a competitor becomes a member. (see EQ111.3)

3018 ASPCA/NHSAA MACLAY HORSEMANSHIP TROPHY CLASS

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

The Maclay is open to junior members of USEF who have not reached their 18th birthday in accordance with GR128. Riders must be current members of the National Horse Show Association ("NHSA") in order to compete in all Maclay, Regionals and Finals Classes. Trainers (or coaches when applicable [see USEF GR108]) of riders competing in all Maclay, Regionals and Finals Classes must also be members of the NHSA. The NHSA Membership year is September 1 through August 31. Junior rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer (or coach) annual contributions shall be \$50. 3020 PLATINUM PERFORMANCE USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH LPHS 2* - ILNY 2*

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

Open to Junior/Young Riders who are members of the USEF who have not reached their 21st birthday under Federation Rules. Fences to 3'9". Winners of twenty Talent Search Classes are no longer eligible to compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS, but may compete in the Finals until they win it or reach their 21st birthday under Federation rules. Non-US citizens may compete in the USEF SHOW JUMPING TALENT SEARCH CLASS but not the Finals. To fill a class, three riders must complete the course. Classes with 50 or more entries will be split. (see EQ111.7)

3022 THE NATIONAL PHA EQUITATION CLASS

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

Open to riders under 18 years of age. To be shown over a course of 8 or more fences at 3'6" in height, with at least one combination including an oxer, and two changes of lead after the first fence. The judge will insert two tests into the original course (USEF EQ113 TESTS 1-17). Further testing of the top riders is optional. Only one rider per horse. To fill a class, three competitors must complete the course. (see EQ111.11)

the Federation, or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the Federation steward. Riders entered in this class cannot cross enter into a USEF Medal Class at the same competition. Suitability of a pony to rider will be emphasized. To be shown over a course of not less than six obstacles 2'3" for ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands; 2'6" for ponies over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 13.2 hands; and 3' for ponies over 13.2 hands. If distances between related fences are less than 100' (including in and outs), the distances must be adjusted for each height section. Two tests (EQ113 tests 1-17, excluding test 16) are required during the first round. Only one rider per pony. To fill a class three competitors must complete the course Two cumulative refusals in the USEF Pony Medal Finals will result in elimination, see EQ111.1. This class may be judged as one class, with all height sections run consecutively; or management may elect to divide and pin this class in three separate sections, small, medium and large or to divide into two sections, small-medium and large or small and medium-large. When classes are divided as outlined above an exhibitor may only ride in one section per competition. (see EQ111.6)

W.I.H.S. PONY EQUITATION 3027

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

To be shown over a course of not less than 8 jumps. No junior rider over 12 years of age may compete on a small pony. No junior rider over 14 years of age may compete on a medium pony. Fence heights: 2'3" for ponies not exceeding 12.2 hands; 2'6" for ponies over 12.2 hands and not exceeding 13.2 hands; and 3' for ponies over 13.2 hands and not exceeding 14.2 hands. The suggested distance for the in and out is 20' for small ponies, 22' for medium ponies and 24' for large ponies. The distance must be altered for each height division. WIHS Pony Equitation classes may include any of the following: bending line, narrow jump (5'6"-8'), rollback turn, fence at the end of the ring, long approach to a single jump. It is recommended that the course be consistent with EQ109.11. A numerical score will be given. WIHS Pony Equitation class may run concurrently with the small, medium and large pony division. The green pony division cannot be run with the WIHS Pony Equitation card opened as the fence heights are inconsistent.

3034 ARIAT NATIONAL ADULT MEDAL

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

Open to all Amateur members of USEF and Equine Canada who are eligible to compete in the Adult Amateur Hunter Section at this show (based on USHJA Zone specifications for the shows location.). Additionally, a rider may not compete at the same horse show in any hunter or equitation class in which the jumps exceed three feet, three inches (3'3") or any jumper class set at 1.20m or higher, except the USHJA National Hunter Derby. To be shown over a minimum of eight fences 2'9" to 3' in height, spread not to exceed fence height. The course may be either a Jumper or Hunter type course and must include at least two changes of direction and a combination. Water obstacles (i.e.; water jump, liverpool) are not permitted. The top four riders are required to perform at least two individual tests from USEF EQ113 Tests 1-17. An Open Numerical Scoring System must be used in the first round, with each rider's score announced at the completion of their round. There is no minimum requirement to fill the class. (go to www.ryegate.com)

3036 **USEF ADULT EQUITATION CLASS**

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

Open to Amateur Senior Members of the Federation and USHJA. Application for membership and amateur certification can be made directly to the Federation, or the exhibitor can join prior to the class through the Federation Steward. Only one rider per horse. To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles at 3'3". The course must include one combination which includes an oxer and two changes of direction after the first obstacle.

Two or more tests of the top four competitors are required. EQ113 Tests 1-17. To fill a class three competitors must complete the course. If there are 50 or more entries at the beginning of this class, it must be divided by every other number and run as two separate classes. (see EQ111.5)

3038 KATHY SCHOLL EQUITATION CLASSIC - (ILNY)

The Kathy Scholl Trainers Award: \$15,000 will be presented to the trainer of the winning rider.

Open to 1st, 2nd and 3rd place ribbon winners of classes 3016, 3018, 3020, 3022 at the Lake Placid Horse Show, I Love New York Horse Show. To be shown over a minimum of 10 obstacles at 3'6". This class will be a two-phase competition. In the first phase, each competitor will compete over a course of eight to twelve obstacles at 3'6" performed over a modified jumper course. The Open numerical scoring system will be used in the first phase. In the second phase, the four competitors with the highest scores will return for additional testing. The remainder of the competitors will be placed according to their scores in the first phase.

Junior rider annual contributions shall be \$35. Trainer (or coach) annual contributions shall be \$50. A rider may enter any NHS 3'3" Medal Classes anywhere in the United States according to the conditions published in the current Rule book of the USEF. Any rider in his or her final junior year may not compete in any NHS 3'3" Medal Classes held at a competition with a start date after August 31 of that competition year.

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance and control of the horse. A minimum of twelve (12) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot and canter. The under saddle performance of those riders selected to show under saddle shall count 50%. USEF Tests 1-17.

To be shown over a course of not less than eight obstacles. Course must include: One combination (including an oxer), At least two changes of direction after the first obstacle. At least three of the following: Bending Line, Narrow Jump (5'6"-8'), Roll back turn, Fence at the end of the ring, Long approach to a single jump, 1/3 of the obstacles must be oxers, Obstacle height to be set at 3'3", Maximum width of oxers 3'6", Maximum width of triple bars and hogs backs 4', Liverpools, water jumps or water used as decoration are prohibited.

3040 NEHC JUNIOR HUNT SEAT 3' MEDAL CLASS

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

Open to Junior members of the NEHC who have not reached their eighteenth birthday. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences set to a height from 3' to 3'3" with a combination and two changes of direction after the first obstacle. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion (USEF tests 1-17) To fill a class, at least three competitors must complete the course.

3041 NEHC ADULT AMATEUR HUNT SEAT 3' MEDAL CLASS

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

Open to Adult Amateur members of the NEHC. All contestants are required to perform over at least eight fences set at a height from 2'9" to 3' with a combination and two changes of direction after the first obstacle. One or more individual tests of the top four contestants may be requested at the judge's discretion. (USEF tests 1-17) To fill a class, at least three competitors must complete the course.

3042 THIS NHS ADULT AMATEUR EQUITATION CHAMPIONSHIP

Entry Fee: \$75 Trophy & Eight Ribbons

To compete in the 2025 THIS NHS Adult Championship Classes riders must have been members of the National Horse Show Association ("NHSA") for the current years qualifying period (September 1, 2024-Aug 31, 2025).

To be judged on seat, hands, guidance, and control of the horse. After completion of the jumping phase a minimum of twelve (12) riders, if available, are required to show at a walk, trot, and canter. The flat performance of those riders selected to show in the flat phase shall count 50%. Changing of bit/bridle between phases is permissible. Only riders who have completed the course and competed in the flat phase may receive ribbons. Use of the open numerical system of judging not to be used. USEF Tests 1-23.

Riders competing in the Amateur Owner Hunter sections may ride one horse that they do or do not own in the Adult Amateur Hunter division.

Riders can cross enter between the Amateur Owner Hunter 3'3" and 3'6". In the under saddle class the cross entry restrictions do not apply, but an Amateur Adult must ride in the Adult Amateur Hunter under saddle.

Horses: Horses may be shown by a different rider in any other section or class at the same competition. Horses may not cross enter between any Adult Amateur and any Amateur Owner Hunter sections at the same show.

Horse and Rider Combination: No cross entry restrictions

Fence height: • 3'0" with spreads not to exceed the fence height. • Courses will not be adjusted for ponies. Combining/Dividing Sections:

May be split into three sections: • Adult Amateurs 18-35 • Adult Amateurs 36-49 • Adult Amateurs 50 & over If there are fewer than three (3) entries in one Adult section if offered split it may be combined with another Adult Amateur section

Hunter sections (Adult Amateur, Children's, Ponies) may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in any section

Section Requirements: If the section is held in one day a maximum of four (4) classes may be offered. If the section is held over two days a maximum of five classes may be offered.

LOW ADULT AMATEUR HUNTER

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current com-

Cross Entry: Riders: Riders may not cross enter into any class or section at the same competition where fences exceed 2'9".

Fence Height: • 2'6'

Combining/Dividing Sections: Low Hunter sections (Adults, Childrens, Ponies) may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in any section

AMATEUR JUMPER

Sections offered and requirements:

0.90-1.05m Amateur Jumper
 1.10-1.15m Amateur Jumper

Cross Entry: Rider: Riders that compete in any class over 1.25m are ineligible to compete in an Amateur Jumper class set at 1.20m or below at that competition.

Horse/Pony: Horses may show at 1.40m or below with another rider.

Horse and Rider Combination: If a horse and rider combination compete where fences exceed 1.15m the horse and rider cannot compete in a classic, stake, or highest prize money class at the horse show

A horse and rider combination may not compete in the classic, stake, or highest prize money class in both the 0.90-1.05m Amateur/Junior Jumper and 1.10-1.15m Amateur Jumper at the same horse show.

Should the cross entry rules be violated, points awarded in the lower height class are forfeited for that competition.

Combining/Dividing Sections: If there are fewer than three (3) entries in any section, the sections may be combined at management's discretion allowing each section to compete at their respective height. If sections are combined a horse can only compete at one height in each class.

CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Sections offered and requirements: • Children's Hunter Horse 14 & Under • Children's Hunter Horse 15-17 Cross Entry: Rider: Rider may not cross enter into any other class at the same competition where the fences exceed 3'0" (exception: Children's Jumper, Pony Jumpers, USHJA National Hunter Derby and Equitation Classes where the fences do not exceed 3'6"). A rider on a Children's Hunter Horse may cross enter into the Pony Hunter section or the Green Pony Hunter section at the same competition. In the under saddle if a rider has two or more horses entered, at least one horse is ridden by the original rider, and the additional horse(s) entered may be ridden by another junior rider.

Horses/Ponies: Horses competing in the Children's Hunter Horse section may not cross enter into the Junior Hunter section at the same competition.

Horse and rider combination: No cross entry restrictions

LOW CHILDREN'S HUNTER HORSE

Eligibility: Open to exhibitors who have not yet reached their 18th birthday as of December 1 of the current competition year.

Cross Entry: Riders: Riders may not cross enter at the same competition into the Children's Hunter, Pony Hunter or any class/section where fences exceed 2'9"

Fence Height: • 2'6" Combining/Dividing Sections:

If there are fewer than three (3) horses entered in the Low Children's Hunter Horse section, then they may be combined and judged with the Low Pony Hunter or the Low Adult Amateur Hunter section Low Hunter sections (Adult Amateur, Children's, Ponies) may be combined if there are fewer than three (3) entries in any section

CHILDREN'S HUNTER PONY

Sections offered and requirements

· Small/Medium Children's Pony · Large Children's Pony

Cross Entry: Rider: Rider may not cross enter into any other class at the same competition where the fences exceed 3'0" (exception: Children's Jumper, Pony Jumpers, USHJA National Hunter Derby and Equitation Classes where the fences do not exceed 3'6"). A rider on a Children's Hunter Pony may NOT cross enter into the Pony Hunter section or Green Pony Hunter section at the same competition. The cross entry restrictions do not apply in the under saddle, but juniors must ride in the Children's Hunter Pony under saddle.

Horse/Pony: Ponies showing in the Children's Pony section may not cross enter into the Regular Pony Hunter sections or the Green Pony Hunter section at the same competition.

Horse and Rider Combination No cross entry restrictions

Fence Height: • Small/Medium Ponies: 2'0" with spreads not to exceed height of fence.

· Large Ponies: 2'6" with spreads not to exceed height of fence.

Combining/Dividing Sections: If there are more than twenty-five (25) in any one section then that section may be split into Sections A and B.

If there are fewer than three (3) ponies in the Children's Hunter Small/Medium Pony or Children's Hunter Large Pony, then the classes may be combined and judged together. Cross Entry: Riders: Low Pony Hunter riders may not cross enter into any class where fences exceed 2'9" or into the Children's Hunter Pony, Pony Hunter, or Green Pony Hunter Section at the same competition. Fence Height: • 2'0'

Combining/Dividing: • Can be split.

JUNIOR JUMPER

Sections offered and Requirements: • 0.90-1.05m Junior Jumper • 1.10-1.15m Junior Jumper Cross Entry: Rider: Riders that compete in any class over 1.25m are ineligible to compete in a Junior Jumper class set at 1.20m or below at that competition.

Horse/Pony Horses may show at 1.40m or below with another rider.

Horse and Rider Combination: If a horse and rider combination compete where fences exceed 1.15m the horse and rider cannot compete in a classic, stake, or highest prize money class at the horse show

A horse and rider combination may not compete in the classic, stake, or highest prize money class in both the 0.90-1.05m Junior jumpers and 1.10-1.15m Junior jumpers at the same horse show.

Should the cross entry rules be violated, points awarded in the lower height class are forfeited for that competition

Fence Height: • Junior Jumper 0.90m to 1.05m • Junior Jumper 1.10m to 1.15m

Combining/Dividing Sections

At all licensed competitions, if there are fewer than four entries in either the Performance Hunter 3'3" or Performance Hunter 3'6" they must be combined, but they cannot be combined with any other Hunter sections, except High Performance Hunter. If there are four or more entries in each Performance Hunter section, they must be held separately. If the Performance Hunter 3' 6" and the Performance Hunter 3'3" sections have fewer than three entries after they have been combined they may be further combined with the High Performance Hunter
- 2. If there are fewer than three entries in the High Performance Hunter section it must first be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section or the Green Hunter 3'9" section (or with Green Hunter 3'6"/3'9" if offered combined). If the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter 3'6" section it may then further be combined with the Performance Hunter 3'3" section. but may not be combined with the Green Hunter section(s)
- 3. When the High Performance Hunter section is combined with the Performance Hunter section the following applies:
 a. When combining High Performance Hunter with Performance Hunters, the
- combined sections must offer the same number of classes offered by the Performance Hunter section(s) with which it is combined.
- b. When combining High Performance Hunter with another section. if different amounts of prize money or entry fees were offered in the original sections, the combined sections will use the lower amount for both prize money and entry

- b. Combining:
- Green Hunter section(s) may not be combined with any other hunter section(s). (Exception; The High Performance Hunter section may be combined with the Green Hunter 3'6" and 3'9" sections, see HU164.1)
- 2. Regardless of competition rating, each Green Hunter section that is offered separately must be held separately when there is a minimum of three entries.
- 3. If there are fewer than three entries in a Green Hunter section, that section must be combined with a contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter. 4. If, after combining, there are still fewer than three (3) entries in the combined section, it must be further combined with the next contiguous fence height section of the Green Hunter.
- 5. In the case where there are no entries in the fence height section that bridges the gap between the two non-contiguous fence height sections those two noncontiguous fence height sections may be combined.

At Premier, National or Regional rated competitions if there are fewer than three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, Competition Management may choose to combine the sections. The Competition Management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ122). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count. 3. It is recommended that when competitions anticipate 50 horses or more this section be divided by age of rider or height of horse when prize list is prepared.

three (3) entries in the Amateur Owner 3'3", the Amateur Owner 3'6", the Junior Hunter 3'3" or the Junior Hunter 3'6" sections, competition management may choose to combine the sections. The competition management may choose to combine the sections as necessary, based on the sections with the lightest entries. If sections are combined, the horses must jump the respective height of the original section entered. In addition, while the sections can be combined if entries warrant, in order for Horse of the Year points to count they must be offered separately in the prize list for Premier rated competitions (see HJ121). When sections are combined as per above, three (3) must complete for points to count. 3. Notice to All Exhibitors Regarding Helmets, Electronic Devices & Safe Sport Rules

To All Riders: Please note that the Lake Placid Horse Shows would like to reiterate that the mandatory helmet rule that took effect on April 1, 2012, will continue to be enforced this year on the Lake Placid Horse Show Grounds. The rule has been implemented nationwide at all USEF licensed hunter/jumper competitions.

The rule requires that anyone on horseback on the property wear a helmet at all times. This consists of anyone showing, schooling, or riding horses on and off of the show grounds, including grooms. This is a facility-wide rule.

The Lake Placid Horse Shows will be enforcing the rule with the support of the United States Equestrian Federation. This is a zero tolerance policy and must be taken extremely serious as it is for the safety of everyone involved. Anyone on a horse without a helmet will be asked to dismount immediately.


Any insubordination will be penalized and the individuals will be fined and expelled from the property. Helmets must be worn at all times, so please plan accordingly. The Lake Placid Horse Show Association would like to thank everyone for in advance for acting in accordance with the USEF rule GR801 which is stated below.

The USEF rule GR801.2 reads: It is compulsory for all persons at Federation licensed hunter, jumper or hunter/jumper competitions when mounted anywhere on the competition grounds, to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. Exception: In Hunter or Jumper classes, adults may be allowed to remove their headgear while accepting prizes and during the playing of

the National Anthem only; they must refasten their headgear prior to the lap of honor. It is compulsory for riders in Paso Fino classes, both open and breed restricted including Hunter Hack, where jumping is required and when jumping anywhere on the competition grounds to wear properly fastened protective headgear which meets or exceeds ASTM (American Society for Testing and Materials)/SEI (Safety Equipment Institute) standards for equestrian use and carries the SEI tag. It must be properly fitted with harness secured. A Show Committee, Competition Manage- ment, and Licensed Officials must bar riders without protective headgear from entering the ring for classes in which protective headgear is required and may bar any entry or person from entering the ring if not suitably presented to appear before an audience.

ELECTRONIC DEVICES: The unsafe use of electronic devices, as determined by the competition steward in their sole discretion, including cell phones while mounted is prohibited in all areas designated for schooling and exercise, and while lungeing horses on competition grounds. Earphone(s)/Earbud(s) are prohibited in all areas designated for schooling and exercise.

SAFE SPORT Reminder: All USEF Life and Senior Active members, as well as participants who have regular contact with minor athletes, are required to comply with the U.S. Center for SafeS-port training requirement to be eligible to participate in the competition. All participants must adhere to the U.S. Center for SafeSport Code, USEF Safe Sport Policy, and the Minor Athlete Abuse Prevention Policies. General Rules & Regulations

 Every class offered herein which is covered by the rules and specifications of the current Federation Rule Book, will be conducted and judged in accordance therewith.

LIFE, SENIOR ACTIVE AND JUNIOR ACTIVE MEMBERS SHALL BE ELIGIBLE TO PARTICIPATE IN ALL CLASSES AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS AT THE MODIFIED LEVEL OR ABOVE AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE, REINING AND VAULTING COMPETITIONS AND ENDURANCE RIDES. A NON-MEMBER MAY PARTICIPATE AS A HANDLER, RIDER, DRIVER, OWNER, LESSEE OR AGENT AT REGULAR COMPETITIONS, EVENTING COMPETITIONS, DRESSAGE COMPETITIONS, REINING COMPETITIONS AND COMBINED DRIVING COMPETITIONS UPON PAYMENT OF A SHOW PASS FEE. PARTICIPANTS IN THE FOLLOWING CLASSES ARE EXEMPTED FROM THE REQUIREMENTS OF THIS RULE: 1) LEADLINE; 2) EXHIBITIONS; 3) GAMES AND RACES; 4) CLASSES FOR 4-H MEMBERS; 5) WALK TROT AND ACADEMY CLASSES (ACADEMY CLASSES ARE CLASSES LIMITED TO HORSES USED REGULARLY IN A LESSON PROGRAM); 6) USDF INTRODUCTORY LEVEL TESTS, PAS DE DEUX AND QUADRILLE CLASSES; AND 7) ASSISTANT HANDLERS IN DRESSAGE SPORT HORSE BREEDING CLASSES.

FEDERATION ENTRY AGREEMENT

By entering a Federation-licensed Competition and signing this entry blank as the Owner, Lessee, Trainer, Manager, Agent, Coach, Driver, Rider, Handler, Vaulter or Longeur and on behalf of myself and my principals, representatives, employees and agents, I agree that I am subject to the Bylaws and Rules of the United States Equestrian Federation, Inc. (the "Federation") and the local rules of the competition.

I agree to be bound by the Bylaws and Rules of the Federation and of the competition. I will accept as final the decision of the Hearing Committee on any question arising under the Rules, and agree to release and hold harmless the competition, the Federation, their officials, directors and employees for any action taken under the Rules.

I represent that I am eligible to enter and/or participate under the Rules, and every horse I am entering is eligible as entered.

I also agree that as a condition of and in consideration of acceptance of entry, the Federation and/or the Competition may use or assign photographs, videos, audios, cablecasts, broadcasts, internet, film, new media or other likenesses of me and my horse taken during the course of the competition for the promotion, coverage or benefit of the competition, sport, or the Federation. Those likenesses shall not be used to advertise a product and they may not be used in such a way as to jeopardize amateur status. I hereby expressly and irrevocably waive and release any rights in connection with such use, including any claim to compensation, invasion of privacy, right of publicity, or to misappropriation.

If not currently a USEF Active Competing member or Subscriber and competing only in classes that are exempt from membership requirements, I acknowledge and agree that I will be enrolled at no cost as a USEF Fan and my USEF Fan Account will continue to annually automatically renew unless and until USEF determines in its sole discretion to terminate my Fan account. Additionally, I acknowledge that the benefits of a USEF Fan are subject to change without notice.

The construction and application of Federation rules are governed by the laws of the State of New York, and any action instituted against the Federation must be filed in New York State.

Horse Recordings GR1102 - The Federation maintains the only official record of winnings of horses at all Regular Competitions. To keep these records consistent, a horse should be recorded with the Federation in the same name of horse and owner under which it is exhibited at competitions. The Federation's horse recording records are not a title registry and the Federation does not decide, otherwise resolve, or become involved in ownership disputes.

Microchipping HU101 - JP 100 - EQ103 - A microchip used to verify identity must be a fifteen digit ISO compliant 11784/11785 chip and be implanted in the such alligament of the animal. All horses that are competing in classes which require USHJA registration which are not microchipped will be ineligible to compete in Federation licensed competitions.

2. OPENING & CLOSING DATES:

- Entries will be limited on a First-Come First-Serve basis (USEF GR 907.1 & 915.2a). Entries open immediately upon publication of this prize list. The closing date for entries will be Friday, May 23, 2025.
- b) The Lake Placid Horse Show Association requires that nomination fees, hunter, equitation fees, grounds fees, stabling fee, \$125 Office fee and USEF Drug & Admin fee accompany each entry blank.

Entries will be processed only when accompanied by payment of the above fees. Make all checks payable to the Lake Placid Horse Show Association in United States funds. Entry blanks must be signed by the owner or his authorized agent, trainer, riders, and/or coach. Acknowledgments will not be mailed.

3. ENTRIES & NOMINATIONS

- Post Entries will be accepted provided stalls are available with a one time late fee of \$100
- b) Nominations for all Jumper Sections and classes close May 23. Post nominations will be accepted after May 23 at the regular nominating fee of \$250 plus a late charge of \$125 unless otherwise stated.
- c) Declarations to show horses which have been nominated for the Jumper Division must be made during Competition Office hours (see Rule No. 15) and received by the Competition Secretary no later than 4:00 pm the day before the class is held unless otherwise noted. At management's discretion entries received after 4:00 pm may be accepted and a late fee of \$50 per class will be assessed for all classes other than Grand Prix and Classic declarations.
- d) Late or improper Grand Prix/Challenge Cup/Classic declarations: Declarations received after the published deadline or declarations improperly completed will be accepted at management's discretion. A penalty of \$100 per \$10,000 class or less; \$150 per \$25,000 \$35,000 class; \$175 per \$50,000 will be assessed without exception. In the event of acceptance of a later declaration where Starting Order is established, the declared entrant will be placed prior to the #1 position in the Starting Order.
- Horses competing in classes in which they have not been entered will be required to pay a double entry fee in those classes.
- Each entry form must give the owner, rider, trainer, and horse USEF/USHJA membership numbers; owner, rider and trainer proper mailing address; telephone numbers.
- g) USEF & USHJA: Each horse will be charged a USEF fee of \$23 per national competition (\$15 Drug & Medication, \$8 USEF) and a \$10 per horse, per competition USHJA Zone support fee. All owners, senior, junior, amateur, adult amateur riders and trainers are required to present the actual or a copy of their USEF/USHJA membership card to the Competition Secretary. Junior and pony hunters must present their measurement cards at the Competition Office before numbers may be picked up. To speed processing, please send a copy of your card(s) with your entry forms. All ponies and junior hunters that do not possess a current measurement card must be measured prior to competing in those classes in which a measurement card is required. Time and place of measurement stations will be announced. For membership info go to www.USEF.org or www.USHJA.org.
- h) USEF Eligibility/ USHJA Show Pass Fees:

USEF Non-member participants in the role of riders, drivers, handlers, vaulters, lungers, owners, lessees, and agents must pay a Show Pass fee. Competitions cannot accept payment for a Show Pass from exhibitors. Show Pass purchases can only be made online on the USEF website by exhibitors.

Non-member participants in the above roles are limited to obtaining no more than one (1) Show Pass per competition year.

To be eligible to participate at Federation Licensed Competitions, all persons acting as coaches or trainers, and legal guardians signing entry blanks as coaches or trainers on behalf of their minors must be Senior Active Members in good standing.

The eligibility requirement for foreign participants went into effect on September 1, 2023, and under this requirement, foreign participants are no longer permitted to participate in USEF national competitions by merely demonstrating good standing with their own National Federation. A few important notes on this:

- Foreign Participants will now be required to join USEF as Competing Members.
- Those individuals 18 years of age and older must take SafeSport Training to be eligible to participate in USEF national competitions.
- For those participating in FEI events only, this requirement does not apply.
- This requirement has been in effect since September 1, 2023, for all foreign competitors except Equestrian Canada competitors.

The online Show Pass form will be available on the USEF website and can be accessed at the following URL: https://www.usef.org/show-pass The Show Pass form cannot be completed until a competition start date is within the next 7 days or if the show is currently in progress.

USHJA Show Pass fee for non members of the USHJA \$30 per competition.

- USEF IHP Fees: All riders competing in any USEF Computer Ranked Grand Prix are subject to USEF International High Performance fee in accordance with GR 207. A \$35 per horse fee will be accessed for each horse on a per class hasis
- j) The responsible party as listed on the entry form will be responsible for all entry fees, nomination fees, and stabling fees of all horses entered or nominated on the entry form.
- k) If necessary to meet time schedule requirements and preserve a balance with entries in other divisions; management reserves the right to limit the number of entries in each division. If entries are limited, horses will be accepted based on USEF National Horse of The Year points earned from December 1, 2023 to November 30, 2024. Management also reserves the right to combine or cancel classes due to insufficient entries.

General Rules & Regulations

- I) A fine of \$100 plus collection fees will be made for all non-negotiable checks. Foreign competitors, please pay in U.S. funds to avoid discount charges.
- Non-Competing Horse Fee: A fee of \$150 will be charged to each horse who is on grounds and not competing in a horse show.

4. SCRATCHES/REFUNDS:

- Horses entered in hunter sections, classes or equitation classes must be scratched by written notice and presented or sent to the Competition Secretary. A Veterinarian Certificate is not required. This written notice must be in the possession of the Secretary one hour prior to the start of the hunter section/class scratched. When valid notice of a scratch is received, the entry fee will be credited less a \$75 per hunter section and the non refundable Office Processing Fee. Once a hunter section has started, horses that are not competing in classes in which they are entered will forfeit their fees unless the horse becomes ill or injured prior to the class or classes in which it is entered. In this case, in order to qualify for a credit, a scratch sheet must be filled out and presented to the Secretary prior to the start of the class or classes being scratched. In addition, an Official Veterinarian Certificate must be filled out and signed by the Official Competition Veterinarian, certifying the illness or injury, and presented to the Secretary no later than one hour after the final class of the competition.
 - In all jumper classes in which a declaration to compete is made, once the class has started, the entry fee as stated in the Prize List will be charged whether the horse is shown or not. In order to scratch a horse from classes declared, an official form (scratch sheet) must be filled out and presented to the Secretary before the start of the class being scratched. Upon timely receipt of the scratch form, the entry fee will be credited.
- No stall fees will be refunded after the closing date of entries. c)
- A scratch fee of \$158 will be assessed on all horses scratched after the closing d)
- HUNTER SCORING: The open numerical hunter scoring system will be used at the discretion of Management.
- COURTESY CIRCLE: Management reserves the right to limit the Courtesy Circle in Hunter and Equitation classes in accordance with USEF rules.
- HORS CONCOURS: No horses or ponies will be allowed in any jumper, hunter or equitation class 'hors concurs' during the competition.
- COMPETITION RING ACCESS: Horses will not be allowed in the competition rings for schooling before competition hours with the exception of warm-up days. Hand walking of horses may be permitted at management's discretion.
- NUMBERS: Competitors competing without a number or with an incorrect number may be refused an award at Management's discretion.

10. ATTIRE:

- Appropriate dress is required in all classes.
- b) Formal Jumper Attire. Dark, muted or similar colored, or red (scarlet) coats are required; team or sponsored coats of different colors are also permitted; white or fawn breeches; a white tie, choker (unless the shirt, by design, has the chocker built in for its intended use) or hunting stock, and a white or lightly colored shirt must be worn. Shirts must have a white collar and white cuffs. Shirts must be fastened at the neck and tucked into breeches. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn. Members of the Armed Services or the police may wear the service dress uniform with protective head- gear. (See General Rules, GR801.2)

Proper Jumper Attire. Coats of any color are required. Breeches must be light color (white, fawn or canary). Pas- tel and dark colored breeches are not allowed. Shirts, light in color, must be tucked into breeches and fastened at the top of the neck. Ties or chokers of any color must be worn (unless the shirt, by design, has the choker built in for its intended use). Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being

Standard Jumper Attire. Coats are not required. Breeches of any color are permitted. Shirts (polo shirts are permitted) must have collars and sleeves (sleeves may be either long or short), and must be tucked into breeches. Sleeveless shirts and shirts with exposed hoods are prohibited. Boots are required. Half chaps are permitted as long as the color matches the paddock boots being worn.

In extreme weather conditions, the use of jackets, sweaters or raincoats can be allowed by management and/or permission from the Jumper Judge/s. Permission must be granted before entering the competition ring.

In cases where the above requirements are not followed, the penalty for a first or minor offense will be a warning and for repeated violations by the same exhibitor at the same event, the penalty may be elimination.

Hunter Riders are required to wear conservatively colored coats (black, blue,

green, grey or brown) which are free from adornment which in the judge's opinion is overly distracting. Shirts must have a choker, similar collar or tie. Breeches may be buff, canary, tan, rust or white.

Hunter Formal Attire. Riders are required to wear scarlet or dark coats; white shirts with white stock, white, buff or canary breeches. Members of the Armed Services or the Police may wear the Service Dress Uniform.

Hunter Inappropriate attire. When management permits Hunter or Hunter/Jumping Seat Equitation riders to ride without jackets, riders must wear traditional, short, or long-sleeved riding shirts with chokers or ties. Polo shirts and full chaps are not permitted except in unjudged warm-up classes. Management or Judge may eliminate an exhibitor who is inappropriately attired. See GR 801 & HU129.

- ALL exhibitors must wear properly fitted protective headgear with a chin strap that passes or surpasses ASTM/SEI standards while riding on the competition grounds. (USEF GR 801.2)
- No mounted exhibitor may wear or carry an electronic communication device (i.e., cellular telephone, pager, walkie talkie, etc.) while in the competition ring. The penalty for wearing or carrying a forbidden device if observed by the judge is elimination from the class during which the device was worn or carried. Exception: A handicapped participant may use electronic devices if, prior to the class, he/she presents to the USEF Steward written justification from treating personnel setting forth the necessity of the equipment.
- USEF Rule HU-3 & JP103: The use of any device with ear bud(s) while mounted is prohibited in all hunter and jumper schooling rings.
- AWARD CEREMONIES: Riders are required to ride for awards in all Classic/Grand Prix and Team competitions, unless notice of ceremony cancellation has been given. Failure of a rider to be present will result in forfeiture of all prizes won in the class.
- ORDERS OF GO: Produced in accordance with Federation Rules JP 112 and HU 126. Riders and trainers who have conflicts due to classes in more than one ring at the same time should see the Starter or Technical Coordinator so that the necessary adjustments can be made. At no time will any ring be held up over three (3) minutes due to conflicts.

13. STABLING:


- The Lake Placid Horse Show Association has the right to permit horses to come and go at will (exception FEI). We have elected to do so within certain guidelines upholding our no poling policy.
- Stabling will be temporary 10'x10' housed under canvas with stall doors on prepared dirt flooring. Fee of \$400 per horse stall and \$425 per tack stall, tax included for each show and will be on a first come first serve basis. A charge of \$25 per competition will be added for each stall reserved after the closing date
- Competing out of a van or truck parked on the competition grounds is prohibited. c)
- Horses will be admitted to the show grounds, between the hours of 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. according to the following schedule: Lake Placid Horse Show, Sunday, June 22 and I Love New York Horse Show, Monday, June 30. No horses will be allowed to enter the show grounds prior to Sunday, June 22. Anyone wishing to arrive at any other time must make special arrangements with the management - call (518) 523-9625.
- e) Initial bedding will not be provided.
- Unless special arrangements are made with management, stalls must be vacated no later than 12:00 noon the day following the conclusion of each competition.
- g) STALL FEES ARE NOT REFUNDABLE UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES.
- Exhibitors are responsible for any damage done to their stalls, intentionally or h) not, and will be charged accordingly.
- Tack and feed stalls may be withheld without warning if the maximum number of stalls per show has been reached. This may occur prior to the closing date.
- COURSES: In accordance with USEF rules
- COMPETITION OFFICE HOURS: Competition days Open one hour before the start of the first class and closes immediately following the last class or 5:00 pm whichever is later. Non-Competition Day hours will be from 9:00 a.m. until 5:00 p.m.
- 16. ACCOUNT SETTLEMENT: All accounts must be settled in full no later than 5:00 p.m. on the last day of each scheduled competition. In order to remove any animal or equipment from the grounds, a release must be obtained from the Competition Secretary.
- 17. CHECK CASHING: Lake Placid Exhibitors only will be allowed to have checks approved and endorsed. All checks must be endorsed by an authorized Lake Placid Horse Show personnel. Upon endorsement by an authorized officer, exhibitors must present their check to Community Bank. Checks presented for cash at Community Bank must be properly endorsed by an Authorized Competition Official. Photo id is required at Community Bank. A fine of \$100 will be charged and suspension of check cashing privileges for any member presenting a non-negotiable check. Persons presenting non-negotiable checks may be subject to prosecution.


18. PRIZE MONEY:

General Rules & Regulations

Income Forms will be issued to the payee as listed on the entry form.

- b) Prize money won by foreign competitors: Be advised that the U.S. Internal Revenue Service requires sporting events to withhold 30% of prize money won in the United States. Foreign competitors should apply for a U.S. Social Security number and will be asked to complete Form 8283 or complete a W-8 Certificate of Foreign Status form.
- 19. FARRIER: No farrier other than the official competition farrier will be permitted to shoe on the grounds without the express permission of the management. Exhibitors wishing to use another farrier must request a permit for that farrier at the stabling office.
- 20. FEED & BEDDING: Provided by the 'Official Feed Store' of the Lake Placid Horse Shows. In order to assure exhibitors of an adequate supply of feed based on fair market prices, no other feed vendor other than the Official Feed Store will be permitted on the grounds without the express permission of the Management.
- ASSIGNED/RESERVED PARKING: Limited reserved parking spaces. Go to Show Office.
- 22. DOGS: All dogs must be leashed at all times while on the Lake Placid Horse Show grounds. Loose dogs will be picked up and detained until the owner has paid a \$100 fine. For a second offense, the owner may be barred from competing and required to leave the show grounds. We find this extreme action necessary in order to protect exhibitors from injury and to protect their financial investment. This rule will be strictly enforced.
- 23. MEDICAL WASTE: In accordance with the 1989 Federal Waste Tracking Act which restricts the disposal of medical waste, Bio Hazardous Medical Waste Containers will be provided in the stable area. All exhibitors, and their agents are responsible for the proper disposal of this waste.

(HJ104.3) Any trainer, owner, exhibitor or their agent found improperly disposing of needles or other sharp instruments will be fined \$100.

24. LIABILITY

- The Lake Placid Horse Show Association, The Town of North Elba, North Elba Parks and Recreation District, US Security Associates, and Showtime Jumps LLC and their officials, sponsors and employees will not be held responsible for any accident or loss which may occur to any exhibitor, spectator, guest, rider, groom, attendant or other employee, animal or equipment at all of the shows listed in this publication.
- The Lake Placid Horse Show Association, The Town of North Elba, North Elba Parks and Recreation District, US Security Associates, and Showtime Jumps LLC and their officials and employees will not be held responsible for any lost, stolen or damaged packages received / delivered to the show grounds.
- "All owners and competitors are personally responsible for damages to third persons caused by themselves, their employees, their agent or their horses. They are therefore strongly advised to take out third party insurance providing full coverage for participation in equestrian events at home and abroad, and to keep the policy up to date.'
- HORSE SHOW VAN PARKING will not be permitted on the show grounds. Upon arrival all drivers will be given directions to a parking lot (with 24 hour security) 2 miles from the show grounds. We find this necessary to alleviate parking congestion on the show grounds.
- MOTORIZED VEHICLES: Minors who do not have a valid driver's license which allows them to operate a motorized vehicle in the state in which they reside will not be permitted to operate a motorized vehicle of any kind, including, but not limited to, golf carts, motorcycles, scooters, or farm utility vehicles, on the competition grounds of licensed competitions. Minors who have a valid temporary license may operate the above described motorized vehicles as long as they are accompanied by an adult with a valid driver's license. The parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating a motorized vehicle in violation of this rule are solely responsible for any damages, claims, losses or actions resulting from that operation. Violations of this rule will be cause for penalties against those responsible for the child committing the offense. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

The unsafe use of personal electronic transport devices, as determined by the competition officials and management in their sole discretion, that do not require a driver's license to operate, including but not limited to segways, hover boards, and single wheeled scooters is prohibited on competition grounds.

Operating such devices in areas where people gather may be deemed "unsafe use" if there is a risk of harm to others. If the operator of the device is a minor, the parent/legal guardian or individual who signs the entry blank as a parent or guardian of a minor operating the device in violation of this rule is accountable and may be subject to penalties. Wheelchairs and other mobility assistance devices for individuals with disabilities are exempt from this rule.

27. LPHS GENERAL & ANIMAL WELFARE POLICY

Upholding the welfare of the horses exhibited here is of primary concern to the Lake Placid Horse Show Association, Inc. and Showtime Jumps LLC. We require that all horses be treated with kindness, respect and compassion and never be subject to mistreatment.

Owners, trainers, riders and grooms, or their agents, must use reasonable care in the handling and treatment of their horses, whether owned or placed in their care for competition or for any other purpose. HJ106 All horses while in exercise areas or lunging areas must have a show number attached to the horse or the individual riding or handling. Any horse without the correct number will be asked to leave the area.

At all times for horses competing on the Lake Placid Horse Show grounds we will provide for the continuous well-being of the horse by vigorously enforcing the rules of the USEF, which pertain to the welfare of the horse. Exhibitors are cautioned that GR839 (which defines the USEF's policy on abuse), GR844 (which pertains to Poling), and GR803 (which pertains to the Use of Whips), will be strictly enforced. Any handling and veterinary treatment should ensure the health and welfare of the horse. High standards of nutrition, health, sanitation and safety shall be encouraged and maintained at all times. Adequate provision will be made for ventilation, feeding and watering and maintaining a healthy environment. Any method of riding and training should take account of the horse as a living entity, and must not include any technique considered to be abusive. The well being of the horse must be considered above the demands of the breeders, trainers, riders, owners, dealers, organizers, sponsors or officials. Violators are subject, under the above rules, to elimination from competition and to protest or charge with resulting formal proceedings which may result in severe fines, suspensions or other penalties.

To affirm the sport of show jumping to the general public in a positive, humane light, and eliminate those training methods which may be misconstrued, we are maintaining the following policy for all horses competing on the Lake Placid Horse Show Grounds, starting one half hour before the first scheduled class of competition and continuing until the last scheduled class of the competition is completed.

28. POLING AND OFF-SETS:

Manual poling and/or the use of bamboo off-sets are prohibited for all horses competing at the Lake Placid Horse Show Grounds. Any rider, trainer, groom or any other person who is in violation of the rules set forth above will be fined \$500 for each incident and may be suspended from further competition for the duration of the scheduled competition starting from the time of the incident. Any horse upon which a violation of the manual poling and/or use of bamboo offsets rule is perpetrated will be suspended from competition for the duration of the scheduled competition. All entry fees for the classes entered during the suspended period of the horse in question will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

29. USE OF WHIPS & SPURS:

The use of a whip by any rider at any one incident will be restricted to four lashes behind the girth. Any rider, who in the opinion of the judges, stewards or schooling supervisors, uses his whip or spurs in a cruel or excessive manner will be immediately eliminated from the class in which the incident occurred, and be suspended from further competition for a twenty-four (24) hour period starting from the time of the incident.

In the case of further violations by that exhibitor, on the same horse or another horse, the exhibitor may be barred from any or all future classes at the competition in which the violations occurred and all stabling fees, nominations fees and entry fees will be forfeited.

All incidents will be reported in the Steward's Report and reviewed by USEF's Executive Director for possible further investigation and charges for hearing before USEF's National Hearing Committee.

Health Requirements

HEALTH REQUIREMENTS FOR THE ENTRY OF HORSES/PONIES

- New York regulations require that all equines be covered by official interstate health certificates, issued by a licensed veterinarian, showing that the animals are free from any symptoms of any infectious or communicable disease. The certificate shall include the name of the owner and address and destination, number of horses examined, the name, registration number(s), if any, tattoo, if any, sex, age, rectal temperature, color, and markings of each animal listed. Health certificates will become void after 30 days from issue. Health certificates must show animals to be negative to an equine infectious anemia test within the past 12 months. Date of test and approved laboratory must be shown on health certificate. Equine Rhinopneuonitis vaccination is not required: however, if any animal is vaccinated, it is ineligible for entry within 21 days of vaccination. Vehicles transporting animals must have certificates showing that it was cleaned and disinfected under veterinary supervision prior to loading. This information can be written on the health certificate

It is prudent to check with the State of destination as to any additional State Health requirements that must be met. Some States have health requirements that are in addition to those required by the Federal Government.

EQUINE VACCINATION RULE

- At Federation licensed competitions horses, more than 7 months of age, entering the grounds must be accompanied by documentation of Equine Influenza Virus and Equine Herpes Virus (Rhinopneumonitis) vaccinations within six months prior to entering the stables. Horses not in compliance with this rule may be required to leave the competition grounds upon request by Competition Management. Documentation should consist of one of the following methods mentioned below. The frequency of vaccine administration should be per the vaccine manufacturers' or veterinarian's recommendations. It is recommended that vaccines are administered by or under the direction of a veterinarian.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide documentation from the veterinarian on documenting that the horse in question received the vaccinations; name of the vaccines and date of vaccine administration.
- In the case of vaccines administered by a person other than a veterinarian, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a receipt of the vaccine purchase which is signed by the owner, or agent with care, custody, and control of the horse; name, serial number and expiration date of the vaccine; and date of vaccine administration.
- In the case of a horse that is unable to receive either of the vaccinations due to a history of adverse reactions, the exhibitor, upon request by Competition Management, must provide a letter from the veterinarian on official letterhead stating that the horse in question cannot be vaccinated due to medical concerns and a log of temperatures taken twice daily for the seven days prior to entering the competition grounds. These horses must also have their temperature taken and logged twice daily while on the competition grounds. The log of temperatures should be provided to the Competition Management, steward, or technical delegate when requested.
- Competition Management may not amend or enhance vaccination requirements without prior approval of the Veterinary Committee.







